# **PROGRAM SUMMARY**

The AFTF has focused on three areas, namely Atoll Program, Male' Program and Strengthen Partnership with NGOs in Male'. **Atoll Program** focuses on selected regions; in 2013 these were Alifu Alifu Atoll, Alifu Dhaalu Atoll, Baa Atoll and Lhaviyani Atoll. The aim is to support community initiated projects proposed by NGOs in all the islands of these Atolls. Based on the increasing number of requests for financial assistance from Male', AFTF decided to incorporate **Male' Programs** as a separate component. Here, AFTF focuses on providing assistance for education and medical initiatives benefiting the whole community. During the reporting year AFTF did not support any projects that fell into medical category.

AFTF supported all activities of the Drop-In-Center of Journey NGO under the focus to **Strengthen Partnership with NGOs** in Male'. Drop-In-Center intervened drug users and recovering users through various activities and outreach services. These services included client sessions, parental sessions, providing counselling, educating families and co-dependents, reference to various needed services provided by National Drug Agency. Journey also disseminated informative education materials to drug users. Below is the summary on the 3 focus areas and further details on individual projects can be seen in the section on project details.

# **ATOLL PROGRAM**

Ali Fulhu Thuthu Foundation's atoll program for the year is targeted to support projects initiated by communities of Alifu Alifu, Alifu Dhaalu, Baa and Lhaviyani Atolls. These atolls are selected in the aim to support community initiated projects in all the atolls of Maldives and taking 3 to 4 atolls each year. 8 islands of Alifu Alifu Atoll are inhabited and the population is 5,776. 10 islands of Alifu Dhaalu Atoll are inhabited and the population is 8,379. 13 islands of

Baa Atoll are inhabited and the population is 9,578. 5 islands of Lhaniyani Atoll are inhabited and the population is 9,190.<sup>1</sup>

At the beginning of the year AFTF started contacting secretariats of all the islands and compiled a contact list of registered NGOS, Associations, Women's Development Committees (WDC), Parent Teacher Associations (PTA) and Clubs who would be the project implementing agencies. In preparations for the field visits, the secretariats are informed officially by a letter and information sheet giving details of the purpose of the visit, travel and meeting schedule. Secretariats were requested to deliver the information to all NGOs. Before the team travelled to the islands, AFTF directly contacted everyone in the compiled list to make sure if they have been informed of the visit and if they have been invited to the meeting.

AFTF produced plaques on metal sheets for the projects funded by AFTF. During 2013 AFTF dispatched plaques to required projects funded. These plaques are handed to focal points on signing of the MoU and mostly dispatched with delivery of items. AFTF did not place any plaques on projects funded in the past 4 years. This year AFTF contacted project focal points of the projects implemented in the past 4 years and delivered these plaques to the islands. AFTF requested NGOs to forward pictures to AFTF after placing the plaques. AFTF monitored this exercise over telephone.

In addition to placing plaques AFTF printed 2 different sizes of stickers stating 'Donated by AFTF' which is specially designed for smaller equipment, ICT items, multi-media equipment, indoor sports items. To market AFTF, we also produced stencils cut-outs of 2 different sizes. The stencils were used to spray paint 'donated by AFTF' on bigger items. These were also sprayed on outdoor play items. Basically this one will be used on items that would be placed outdoor.

# FIELD VISIT AND NEED ASSESSMENT

AFTF team travelled to all the islands in Alifu Alifu and Alifu Dhaalu Atoll from 27<sup>th</sup> to 31<sup>st</sup> January 2013 and travelled to all the islands in Baa and Lhaviyani Atoll from 24<sup>th</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup> February 2013. AFTF held general introductory meeting with all NGOs. In these meetings NGOs were given information on the purpose of the visit, who AFTF is and why AFTF is visiting the islands. Procedures for applying for funding through AFTF were explained in detail and the areas to propose were left for the communities to decide, explaining the areas proposals have been submitted to AFTF during past 4 years. AFTF highlighted that AFTF will be granting in-kind donations only.

In these meetings NGOs as well as the secretariat shared needs of the communities and NGOs plans for the year. Funding constraints were the main issue highlighted by the NGOs in implementing projects planned. AFTF's travel plan is scheduled in a manner that AFTF get enough time to hold separate meetings with NGOs and visit sites of the on-going projects implemented by NGOs. This gives a very clear picture of work done by NGOs and this also helps AFTF to understand the requirements for planned activities for the year. AFTF captured pictures while visiting the sites.

# PROPOSAL SUBMISSION, EVALUATION AND AWARDING

During these visits, AFTF distributed project application forms with information sheets. Interested parties were asked to fill this simple proposal form in Dhivehi summarizing project activities, objectives, project participants and benefits in implementing the project. They were also required to provide a list with contacts of the project implementing committee with appointment of one member as the focal point among the members of the implementing committee. Duration of the project, commencement date and finishing date have to be clearly specified on the proposals. They were also required to provide a detailed budget, listing items required and estimate cost with taxes. AFTF had learnt that not all NGOs has the capacity of writing proposals for funding, hence made application form simple that any interested party would be able to fill in and submit for AFTF funding. All NGOs were given a duration of 2 weeks to submit applications to AFTF. In 2013, AFTF followed the same strategy that AFTF's role is to only provide funding and that implementation of projects falls under the role of NGOs.

AFTF team assessed all the proposals based on how the project will benefit a larger number of the communities. Moreover, priority was given to sustainable projects, keeping in mind the number of beneficiaries. Need assessments done during the field visit helped in the assessment to identify if the submissions are related to projects planned or are going to be implementing in the sites seen by the team during the field visits. It also helped to determine if the project could be completed with the donations from AFTF.

All projects were selected within the budget line. This year AFTF allocated USD 5,000.00 per island. Some islands distributed this budget line among smaller projects and some islands submitted one proposal within the allocated budget.

After selection of the projects, NGOs were contacted through telephone and fax and by mail to inform about the selection and to award the projects. AFTF officially sent out letters to the secretariats of the islands listing the proposals submitted by specific islands and projects awarded to that particular island.

To award the projects, AFTF signed a Memorandum of Understandings with relevant NGOs. This MoU detailed the role of NGOs and conditions set by AFTF and the time period in which the projects will be implemented. On signing of the MoU, AFTF coordinated with project focal point to discuss the implementation procedures and delivery of items to the islands.

AFTF scheduled delivery plan in a manner that items were delivered in time for the project starting date as specified in the proposals. It was really helpful as most of the NGOs had a contact assigned to coordinate from Male' end. Sometimes meetings were held with these focal points at AFTF office for smooth delivery of items to the islands.

NGOs were requested to inform AFTF in time, the arrival of vessels from their islands. When this information is communicated AFTF made arrangement on delivery of items to the islands. The focal points in Male' sometimes collect items from AFTF office if the collection is in a small number. Bulk deliveries were arranged so that it is delivered to the vessel direct from the vendor.

AFTF ensured that staff was always accessible over the phone and we responded to NGOs about the selected projects in two weeks as promised and materials are delivered to the islands closer to the commencement of the project as stated in the proposals.

### **FUNDING CATEGORIES**

In 2009 and 2010 AFTF solely concentrated focus on youth projects. In light of the lessons learnt in these two years, AFTF found that communities wanted AFTF to fund other social projects and mostly raised issues with primary education in the communities. Hence in 2011 AFTF broadened to cater the needs of the communities by keeping it open for the communities to propose on the most needed areas for them. Since 2011, AFTF have been adding new areas to the categories and this year also AFTF added new areas. These areas are categorized focusing on the main cause. For example an infrastructure development project related to education is categorized under education. These areas are listed below.

Education

Projects related to education, provision of equipment, supporting development projects by providing assistance in the completion of finishing work of infrastructure, awareness raising programs and educational competitions.

Sports Projects related to sports, provision of equipment and sports

items, supporting development projects by providing assistance in the completion of finishing work of infrastructure, supporting

training programs and tournaments.

Development Programs Support development projects by providing assistance in the

completion of finishing work of infrastructure directly benefitting

NGOs and development of social projects.

Environment Projects related to environment and provision of items to help

manage disposal of garbage.

Agriculture Projects related to agriculture, Provision of items, and supporting

training programs.

Training and Courses Provide assistance in vocational training and develop skills on art

and craft.

Cultural and Entertainment Support programs to revive culture and assisting in entertainment

programs planned for festivities.

Administration and Development of NGOs

Donate equipment and items to assist in the administration of NGOs. Supporting projects implemented by NGOs that will help generate an income to NGOs to implement programs planned by

the NGOs.



# **SCHOLARSHIPS**

AFTF arranged final installment for the student under the scholarship granted to one student to pursue two year masters in social work program in university of Pennsylvania, United States of America. 50 % of the program fees were sponsored by AFTF and 50% of the fees were granted as a loan. This scholarship was granted on an interest free basis and the student does not have to serve a bond at AFTF.

AFTF also continued the support provided to student undergoing advance level program in the Villa International High School in Male'. Since 2012 AFTF has been supporting the student and the family, by providing accommodation in Male'.

In addition to the scholarships, AFTF supported with travel and accommodation to one member of Junior Chamber International (JCI) Maldives to participant in the interim meeting of Commonwealth Asia Alliance of Young entrepreneurs (CAAYE) held in Singapore from 29-30 June 2013.

The Commonwealth-Asia Alliance of Young Entrepreneurs is a network of young entrepreneurs and the organizations that support them. This Alliance is established to continually promote the cause of young entrepreneurs in respective countries.

### **DROP-IN-CENTER OF JOURNEY NGO**

AFTF signed a written agreement with Journey NGO on 22 January 2013 to support all the activities of its drop-in-center under the project 'Comprehensive care, support and guidance for community re-integration'. The main activities of the center included, drug education, like skills, counselling, group therapy, educating codependents, referrals services to important agencies, intervene drug users through outreach programs and reintegrate by professionally trained facilitators, peer counsellors and addiction professionals of the NGO. All the activities scheduled under the project were conducted during the reporting year. Details of this component can be seen under individual project details.

# UNITED WORLD COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

AFTF continued to support the United World College Scholarship (UWC) program in the Maldives. Every year AFTF offered this scholarship to Maldivian student completing their IGCSE (International General Certificate on Secondary Education) and SSC (Secondary School Certificate) exam to attend a 2 year study program in one of the UWCs. The colleges are coeducational, residential and draw students around the globe. All students follow a curriculum that leads to an International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma. This year, AFTF funded for the final year of 3 students of batch 2012-2014 studying at Mahindra United World College in Pune/India, UWC Atlantic College in Wales/UK and Waterford Kamhlaba. AFTF funded new batch of 2013-2015 this year for 2 students joining the Red Cross Nordic United World College in Norway and Waterford Kamhlaba United World College in Swaziland. AFTF sponsored both the scholarship and will be funding for the 2 year program.

In August 2012 administration of UWC activities and selection process was handed to the alumni passing a resolution that all activities carried out by AFTF as the UWC Maldives National Committee will be handed over to the new UWC National Committee formed by the alumni. The National Committee comprised of a Chairperson, Selections Coordinator, Financial Coordinator, Communications and Publicity Coordinators, Alumni Relations Coordinator and a Program Design Coordinator as decided in the first informal AGM of UWC Maldives held on August 1st 2013. Even though specific alumni were decided for these posts only in August, the National Committee started work in a team with different members addressing the different areas as mentioned above. The total number of active alumni involved in the selections and running of UWC Maldives in 2013 is 12 and 10 of the alumni are currently based in the Maldives. The National Committee met on regular basis near selections period and worked in different teams to address various aspects of selections. The Chairperson ensured smooth coordination between the AFT, UWC IO, Colleges and the National Committee actively involved in organizing selections.

This year National Committee functioned only on the recruitment of students. UWC Maldives is not a registered organization yet and during this interim period, AFTF assisted the National Committee by sharing previous experiences and providing funds for UWC selections and scholarships. AFTF decided to act solely as the funding agency where the National Committee has to propose for funding at the beginning of each year. AFTF executive committee will then decide if the foundation will be providing sponsorship for the scholarships. AFTF will also support cost of non-residents attending to selection from the islands as we feel it is important because quality education is not accessible to majority of the Maldivians so there is a great need to provide it to students who are especially from the islands.

Selection process started with mailing application to all island councils. However, it was difficult to ensure that news of the scholarship and applications were available to the public in the most accessible manner. It is important that UWC Maldives use other avenues on these islands to promote UWCs such as schools and CBO's. Unfortunately on some islands, the fax machines and internet are available only in the council office making it difficult. Travel to the islands is costly and unrealistic for the National Committee. AFTF help UWC National Committee to disseminate information about the scholarship during the visits we make to islands to assess needs for the atoll program we run each year. UWC Maldives need to network and identify NGOs and CBOs to work with on the islands.

Selection planning and conducting took place through September 2012 to April 2013. Camp and interviews were conducted over three days. Students apply for the scholarship through the application form made available of the UWC Maldives website. This application is a questionnaire that has to be submitted with 2 essays and 2 confidential reference letter one from a teacher who knows the student well and the other who have interacted the student in a non-academic setting. Both the references have to be delivered in sealed envelopes. Parent or guardian has to sign an agreement with their information and approval for the student to apply for the scholarship. Minimum age to apply for the scholarship is 16 years and maximum age is 18 years. Application deadline was 24<sup>th</sup> March 2013. This year National Committee received a total of 22 applications out of which 3 applications were from the islands. Among the 22 application there were 10 males and 12 females.

After evaluation of the applications, a pool of students is shortlisted to attend a camp a day camp in Male'. The applicants attending the camp are shortlisted for the interviews based on UWC ideals of 1. Attitude, (Ability to work with each other, positivity, respect, inclusivity vs exclusivity, and tolerance), 2. Creativity. 3. Leadership/initiative taking. The applicants engage in various group activities, presentation and interactive games during the camp. 60% of selections weightage is given to the camp. The short listed applicants who attend the interviews are scored on the following four criteria: 1.Personal Attributes. 2. Intellectual Ability. 3. UWC Ideals. 4. Coping with life. 5 male students and 5 female students were shortlisted for the final interview.

The interview panel consists of two external members who have experience in education field and three UWC alumni. Interview is 40% of the applicants' total score and the applicants with the highest scores are awarded the scholarship. If any family members of the National Committee apply, the members do not participate in the short listing process, camp or interviews.

UWC Maldives hosted an event for selected applicants with alumni in order to share experiences and to enable the selected applicants to ask questions and explain in detail about UWC. Buddy system for selected students need to be revived so that they are better prepared. Alumni discuss the UWC ideals and the different initiatives lead by UWC alumni around the world that embodies UWC ideals.

UWC Maldives assisted selected applicants in acquiring visa and making travel arrangements. However, sometimes delay in communications from the colleges affect National Committee's work in assisting the selected applicants. Relevant documents from the college were share and discussed with the selected applicants. Expectations that the UWC will have in terms of the students' academic and community involvement are also discussed. In addition to this, the National Committee facilitates contact between the selected student and the alumni of the colleges or second year students at the college from Maldives.

Financial aid was provided to the selected applicants after evaluation of the financial aid forms requested to be filled by the parents. Parents were explained on the criteria and eligibility for aid. Evaluation is done by the National Committee with the help of the supporting documents that were asked to be submitted. Annual incomes of the parents were looked over the annual expenses. If the parents can afford, they are not awarded this help.

Students attending the Red Cross Nordic United World College joined college in August. Since the academic year of the Waterford Kamhlaba United World College starts in January 2014, the student would leave in last week of December.

# **LESSONS LEARNT AND CONSTRAINTS**

### **COMPILING LISTS AND CONTACTING NGOS**

Prior to field visit, AFTF started compiling lists of NGOs and the contact numbers. AFTF have known from past years that best method to compile an update list is by contacting secretariats of the islands. Some islands take time to draw up a list and some islands have compiled lists. This information is provided to AFTF over telephone and some islands request an official request from AFTF. Some secretariats take time to forward lists and this cause a bit delay in the planning the trip.

AFTF requested the secretariats with official letters to inform NGO of the visit of AFTF to the islands. AFTF also directly contacted and informed all NGOs of the visit to make sure that they have been contacted and informed as AFTF needs participation of all NGOs in the initial meeting. If an NGO was unable to participate in the meeting, AFTF handed proposal forms to the secretariat to be collected by the NGO. AFTF provided information for these NGOs when contacted.

### FORMAT OF PROPOSAL FORM AND PROPOSING PROJECTS

Project proposal form was revised with some minor changes. This included asking NGOs to include their email address on the required space in the form. AFTF found that most of the NGOs have access to internet. AFTF asked this because sometimes AFTF receive information on funding opportunities via mail, from other funding agencies and having a contact of NGO helps AFTF to forward this information to NGOs. Information was shared with NGOs in the initial meetings, why we ask for mail address, making them clear that AFTF does have the capacity to help them with proposal writing on in any other way since AFTF does not have the capacity to help with other projects while implementing our own projects.

We did highlight in the forms that NGOs need to inform the change of contact numbers of the implementing committees. This is because we have found that members often change their contact numbers and we find it difficult to contact them for monitoring and evaluation of the project.

We have also highlighted on the forms that the budget should be proposed with the inclusion of tax. Even though this information is given in the initial meeting NGOs tend to forget to

include tax while filling up the forms. Hence, when they see this highlighted on the form they are reminded again to include figures with tax.

We have found that some NGOs propose one application for funding two different project areas. We found it difficult to categorize the project under the project areas. For example a proposal was submitted from Adh. Kunburudhoo requested ICT items and 2 lights for the harbor. As this was the only proposal submitted from the island, the project was approved excluding the lights. This matter was discussed with implementing committee of the project and both parties agreed on this.

In the future, AFTF should clearly give information not to propose items that fall into different categories through one proposal. Since they are given option to propose more than one project, all the items requested should relate to the category that they are proposing.

This year AFTF asked NGOs to submit their registration certificates with the application to file and record. And for groups who apply for our funding, we asked them to issue a statement from their respective secretariats to make sure that we will be working with a group who are capable of implementing a project.

Very clear information was given in initial meetings with NGOs that they have to think of every single item that would be required under a project and should be listed with tax values. AFTF also highlighted that once the budget is approved and funding is distributed among the projects it would be difficult to arrange funding for additional items. AFTF supported few projects where additional items were requested to complete the projects. These additional propositions were also evaluated and if the project could not be completed without these items AFTF provided these items, sometimes with the savings made on other projects or with the approval of additional funding from the executive committee of AFTF.

We have also found that boat charges for items are included in the amount for specific items listed in the budget section of the proposal form. Sometimes we manage to settle this within the approved budget. Sometimes boats charges are more due to change of rates in market and also due to bad weather. For a more clear presentation of the budget, boat delivery charges should be listed separately. This information will be shared with NGOs in the future meetings.

### **REVISIONS TO MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**

The MoU signed between AFTF and NGO was revised in 2013. 2 new clauses were added under the role and responsibilities of project implementing committee as described below.

- 1- If an NGO plans and propose a project to be implemented in an institution, school or a social center or any other social project, all the items donated by AFTF should be donated to implement the project in the specific institution. This is to make sure that the NGOs do not use some the items donated for administration or other use of the NGO.
- 2- In the event of dissolution of an NGO or if the NGO had to close down a place where services are provided using AFTF donated items, NGO has to donate all items to an NGO or an institution in the island who can continue the same project or who can use the items donated on social work. This is to make sure that the items can be used by the community even in the event of dissolution of an NGO.

The clause on maintenance of items was revised as described below.

Some NGOs plan and propose to implement projects in other institution. For example projects planned to provide multi-media equipment to schools. Sometimes these institutions take it that the responsibility of maintenance of items donated under project falls on the NGOs. To make it clear this clause was revised stating that the responsibility of maintenance of items donated falls under the institution's responsibility.

### **TRAVEL SCHEDULE**

In the planning process, travel schedule is prepared in a way that more time is allocated to islands having more NGOs. This is because AFTF team will have enough time to make visits to the on-going project sites and make notes of activities implemented by an NGO or activities that the NGO had planned for the year. AFTF has found that there are cases where islands having many NGOs do not have any on-going projects to show to AFTF team. Even though team leaves the island early team has to wait in the next island till the scheduled time. This problem can be solved in the future in the trip planning. We could look into possibilities if we can contact the NGOs and collect information if they would be interested to show us on-going projects or share us information on activities for the year or perhaps take us to visit sites where they plan to implement a project.

We find that some islands raises question to the team during the initial meetings and some islands do not raise any question to the team. This could be seen as that, the team is clear enough and have been very informative.

### **IMPLEMENTATION OF PROJECTS**

On awarding the projects to NGOs AFTF sent official letters to secretariats of the islands with information about the number of proposals submitted from a specific island and the list of projects awarded to that particular island. AFTF found that some secretariats tried to influence the selection process by calling and asking to fund a specific project. In this situation the secretariats are informed that AFTF would not change our decision on the selections.

An NGO in Alifu Dhaalu Atoll planned to implement a project to construct a children's park in an open space in the island. This proposition got shortlisted as a good project and AFTF requested the NGO to forward supporting documents proving that the space have been officially given to the NGO. AFTF found from the secretariat that the NGO planned to implement the proposed project in this space without official approval to use the area. We found that there were internal issues relating to the matter. Information is given in the initial meetings that AFTF would not be supporting any such projects.

Implementation of majority of the projects was hindered due to presidential elections. It was very challenging to implement projects as planned. AFTF had to make several calls to the focal points to pressure and push them to work as scheduled. Sometimes we found it not really easy to contact focal points. This was due to extreme involvement of members of NGOs in elections campaigning. Due to elections, a major delay was seen with projects related to development with finishing of infrastructures.

Rise in price of construction materials is a problem faced every year and the budget had to be revised and adjusted or managed by the savings made on other projects. This year also AFTF noticed increase in construction materials from the time of proposition of projects to purchasing of materials. This year this was not much an issue as the executive committee approved to process donations with the change of price in the construction market. This year Maldives experienced a major shortage in availability of aggregate and core sand by going up by 70% of the normal rate. AFTF faced unavoidable delay in delivery from AFTF's side due to unavailability of items in the market.

Construction work is mainly carried out by the members of NGOs on voluntary basis. Most of the members of the NGOs are full time employees or are self-employed and hence they volunteer to work during weekends. And members employed in resorts work on their off-days. This is a reason why construction related projects get delayed. In most of the islands there are few vocationally trained people and in some islands it's only one person who will have to give time for the projects. This was also a cause for delays in projects related to construction.

Difficulties in transportation of items were faced this year as well. For example B. Kudarikilu planned implementation start date of all projects beginning from April. AFTF was ready with the purchase of items and when enquired on arrival of boats from the island, we were informed that there would be no means of transportation soon. On availability of first transportation in July, AFTF loaded all items on board. Transportation issue is one reason why projects in this island got delayed. Similarly same issue was faced for the project installation of water tanks in B. Fulhadhoo.4 large water tanks purchased under the project was not delivered to the island when year ended. This is because the island does not have boats that can carry heavy, space utilizing materials. The implementing committee tried talking with boats of other islands in the Atoll and unfortunately was not able to arrange a bigger boat for the delivery. As soon as they get the tanks on the island the project would be completed within 2 weeks.

There have been cases when AFTF had loaded items dividing into 2 shipments. This is due to limitations of space in the boat. And this issue is faced only in loading construction materials. Project implementing committee reserves space from the boat and there were couple of cases that we had to take back our delivery when the captain had given the reserved space for another party close to the captain. Since AFTF does not have any warehouse, the issue was solved by our vendors by allowing us to keep the purchased items in their warehouses till the next boat anchors Male'.

We faced one project where the implementing committee had talked with a supplier from the island to supply ICT items from abroad on very low rate compared to market price. To make the advance payments AFTF requested this company to forward account details on an official letter. We were informed that the company does not operate an account and that the payment has to be transferred to an individual account. From here AFTF had doubt that this could not be a genuine party. AFTF discussed matter with project implementing committee and came to an agreement to purchase items from Male'. Additional funding was required for the project and the issue was solved after discussing with the executive committee and getting approval to purchase items with the change is approved funding for the project.

### **REPORTING**

AFTF mainly monitored projects over telephone to assess progress of work. NGOs have to submit project progress reports and project end reports. Also AFTF prepared templates on project progress report and project end report. To assess progress, templates are forwarded to NGOs and they are asked to submit reports with pictures. AFTF found it very difficult to get these reports. AFTF had to make several calls and the answer was that they would be sending it soon. AFTF have noted that the delay in forwarding these reports are again because of the lack of availability amongst members of the NGOs and specifically involvement in election campaigns. All the time was given to political events and they could hardly spare time to complete the reports.

### **OUTCOME**

AFTF informed the islands and NGOs well in advance of our arrival and we found that we could start the meetings as scheduled and NGOs were looking forward for our visit. We were warmly received by the islands. We found that most of the islands have heard about AFTF and mostly it was in a positive aspect as an organization that delivers as promised and as scheduled. Apart from Aa. Feridhoo, all the islands in the 4 atolls submitted proposals on the areas categorized in this report. AFTF implemented a total of 61 projects in the designated regions for the year. In addition to these projects AFTF implemented 4 projects outside the selected region. These projects are discussed under project details of the report.

# **PROGRESS**

Project implementation started in March 2013 and the first delivery was made during this month. AFTF received 22 proposals from Alifu Alifu Atoll except Alifu Alifu Feridhoo Island. 12 proposals were funded out of these 22 propositions. Alifu Dhaalu Atoll submitted 30 proposals out of which AFTF funded 18 proposals. Baa Atoll submitted 43 proposals and AFTF funded 27 propositions from Baa Atoll. Received 8 proposals from and funded 4 proposals from Lhaviyani Atoll. In total, AFTF received 103 proposals and funded 61 proposals from the designated program region. In total funded 65 proposals including the following 4 projects outside designated region.

AFTF also supported 4 projects outside designated region.


- 1- Donation for renovation and furnishing of Adam Saleem Handhaanee Preschool in Ha. Hoarafushi. Flooding of the island in 2012 caused damages to the preschool. Items were donated in January of the reporting year.
- 2- Supporting all activities of Drop-In-Centre of Journey Maldives for the project, comprehensive care, support and guidance for community re-integration. This project is supported through
- 3- Proposed sewerage system in Ha. Thuraakunu. Settled advance payments to consultant to prepare concept design, Survey Island, prepare Environment Assessment Report and detail design report.
- 4- Construction of K. Dhiffushi Health Centre's extension building. Drawings were prepared and contractors were identified during the reporting period. Ministry of Health prepared the designs and BOQ during the year and hence no funds were utilized in 2013.

AFTF funded following 2 projects that was delayed from 2012.

- 1- Completion work of construction of G.Dh Madaveli Preschool, funded in 2012.
- Completion work of Construction of N. Velidhoo Community Centre, funded in 2011.

Finishing work of Lh. Kurendhoo and Sh. Maungoodhoo funeral parlor 'hinavaage' were followed during the year. Funding for these 2 projects was settled in 2012.

Out of the 66 projects funded in 2013, 25 projects fall under education, 14 projects under sports, 9 projects under development programs, 4 projects under environment, 1 project under agriculture, 3 projects under training and courses, 3 projects under cultural and entertainment, 6 projects under administration and development of NGOs and 1 project under strengthening partnership with NGOs in Male'. 47 out of 66 projects were completed successfully by the end of the year. This is 71% of the total projects. Work was in progress in the remaining 19 projects. This is 19% of the total projects. Construction projects fall under this percentage and faced major delays due to unavailability of some construction items in the market and arrival of boats and getting space from the boats of some islands for the delivery of items. Main delay was due to involvement of members of the NGOs in political campaigns in the presidential elections. These causes are highlighted in detail in this report under lessons learnt and constraints faced.



### **MONITORING AND EVALUATION**

Monitoring and evaluation of AFTF funded projects are mainly done through telephone as this is the most convenient and effective way to communicate with implementing committees of the project on periodic basis. We also held meetings with focal points in Male' if they happen to be in Male' and sometimes with members of the NGOs who reside in Male'.

AFTF forwarded its progress report templates and project end report templates to NGOs after completion of the projects and when there is the need to monitor on progress of projects. AFTF requested NGOs to forward pictures when they submitted these reports.

Due to the geographical dispersion of islands and the costly sea transportation it is unrealistic to make individual visits to islands for monitoring purpose. Instead AFTF planned monitoring visits closer to completion of many projects. In 2013 monitoring trip was delayed to 2014 February due to long delayed presidential election and due to extreme involvement of members of NGOs in the elections. It would be difficult and unwise to conduct a monitoring trip amidst the elections. On the other hand AFTF wanted it maintain its transparency for the cause and not let anyone link the donations made by AFTF to the elections.

# **EXPENDITURE SUMMARY**

In 2013, AFTF donated items worth of USD 177,464.65 under atoll program. USD 20,161.93 were spent for scholarships under Male' program education component. AFT donated USD 28,113.00 in two installments to Journey NGO to run all activities of Drop-In-Centre. First installment was made during January 2013 and the second installment was made at the beginning of July after evaluation of activities of the center for the first half of the year. USD 78,046.59 was spent to arrange fees, pocket money and towards travel of the students funded under UWC Scholarship program. AFTF spent USD 57,915.44 on staff, administration and on general expenses. All these figures are tabulated below.

2013, however, delays in installation of the systems were caused as the NGO did not quote projector brackets and the door and windows of the classrooms were not fixed. Since their doors and windows were not fixed, the school and NGO decided that it will not be safe to install the systems

without them.

On request from Kamadhoo School Management, Ministry of Education approved a budget to install the doors and windows of the classrooms on December 2013. By the end of the year, announcements were made to find a contractor for the work. The project is estimated to complete on

February 2014

Island: B. Kendhoo

**Project Title:** Construction of boundary wall of Aisiru Pre School

Funding Amount: USD 4,824.86

Project Summary: The 'Women Development Committee' submitted the proposal for

construction of the boundary wall in Aisiru Pre School in order to keep

the children safe inside the school during play times.

**Project Status:** Contractor for the work was selected by bidding. The contractor with the

lowest price was awarded the construction phase of the project. Construction was carried out with other financial and input assistance from B. Atoll council, Kendhoo Council and Four Seasons Landaa Giraavaru Island Resort. After the construction was completed, Kendhoo

Peoples United NGO painted the wall free of charge.

**Project Title:** Develop the cultural activities in the island.

Funding Amount: USD 5,000.00

Project Summary: 'Dhonfanu Zuvaanunge Rooh' submitted the proposal to assist its

Boduberu group to revive cultural activities by procurement of a sound



On the same month, KIHAA requested to change the rocking chair to 2 wash basins and these items were delivered on November. As the renovation works began late,

the project was incomplete by the end of the year.

Funding Amount: USD 1,787.29

Project Summary: 'Dharavandhoo Development Cooperative Society' submitted the

proposal to conduct a Basic Sewing Course in order to facilitate women

to earn an income staying at home.

**Project Status:** The training course was conducted from 9<sup>th</sup> - 27<sup>th</sup> June 2013, with an

instructor bought from Male'. The course was attended by 18 participants and certificates were given to all participants who attended. At the completion of the course a fashion shows along with a display of

the dresses were held open to all islanders.

**Project Title:** Smart Classroom Project

Funding Amount: USD 3,246.73

Project Summary: The project was initiated by 'Baa Atoll Madharusaa' to improve the

teaching facilities in the school by installing E beam Smart boards in the

classrooms.

**Project Status:** The E beam boards were installed in all classrooms of the school between

19<sup>th</sup> and 21st June. A familiarization workshop was conducted for the teachers. Now all students from grades 1 to 10 amounting to 151

students are benefited by the improved facility in the classroom.

**Project Title:** Development of *Maares* Quran class with modern facilities

Funding Amount: USD 3,242.14

Project Summary: 'Maalhos Recreation and Environment Society (MAARES)' submitted the

proposal with the aim of developing the Quran class to equip modern

facilities and construct a toilet in the class

**Project Status:** Construction of the toilet was outsourced to a contractor and carried out

at the own expense of Maares. With the new equipment in place, the student of the Quran class have shown more interest in learning while

teachers finds is easier to educate the children

**Education Centre** 

Funding Amount: USD 4,763.81

**Project Summary:** Under the program of digitalizing the classroom of Baa Atoll Education

Centre, 'Foundation of Eaydhafushi Youth Linkage (FEYLI)' submitted the

proposal install multimedia projectors in the classrooms.

Project Status: All the items requested for the project was donated to FEYLI by May

2013. But the NGO could not start the installation as the cables and brackets for installation were not listed in the proposed list. Therefore, these items were arranged from the school. Installations of all the

projectors were completed by the end of the year.

Funding Amount: USD 1,285.96

**Project Summary:** The project by 'Youth Club' aims at solving the problem of finding

tableware's for use in feasts organized by the club to mark special

**Project Status:** The utensils donated for this project were used to celebrate Eid al Adha

1434. A large feast was cooked for all the people in the island. Youth Club

plans to hold such feasts in future.

**Project Title:** Renovate the roofing of the school building and improve the

administration of school

Funding Amount: USD 5,259.26

Project Summary: 'Thuthu kudhinge Preschool' initiated to renovate the roofing of the

school building and improve the school administration through modern

facilities

**Project Status:** Project was carried out directly under supervision of Thulhaadhoo

Silvershine Club. Before the project was awarded by AFTF, the roofing structure was changed and roofing sheets were placed. However, after the project was approved and items were donated completion of the roof was carried out. At the prize day of the school, a shield was presented to

carry out the work. HIDA plans to carry out the marketing activities.

**Project Summary:** At the initiation of 'Women Development Committee' the project aims to

establish a facility for safe storage of drinking water for usage during

shortage.

**Project Status:** Though the project proposal was submitted by WDC, the island council

lead the project. Items for the construction of a shed for the tanks were delivered to Fulhadhoo on July 2013. However, the construction was contracted late October. By the time the shed construction was completed, the tank manufacturer in Maldives was out of raw materials and could not produce the tanks. Manufacturer estimates to complete the tanks by February 2014. Once the tanks are completed AFTF will

spray paint AFTF logo and the tanks will be delivered to the island.

**Project Summary:** Fehendhoo Youth club submitted the proposal to renovate a classroom

classroom for both Youth club and WDC office. However, with the request from the islanders, island council have started discussion with Ministry of Education to re-open the school. the renovation work was kept on halt when the year ended.

At present the computer systems donated to Youth club and Preschool are used in the island council office as the Preschool building is not safe to keep such items. But the computer system donated to WDC is kept unused. The Youth Club and WDC say that a permanent solution will be

found only when an administrative office is set-up is in place.

to organize and hold more sports activities.

**Project Summary:** The project's objective is to complete the phase 2 of 'Kurendhoo



Compost tumbler method the project was later changed to import a compost machine from abroad. Order was placed with 'I Eco Green Technologies', a Chinese manufacturer for the compost machine on September 2013. However, due to delays caused from the manufacturer side, the machine was not shipped to Maldives by the end of the year. Manufacturer informed Eco Youth that the machine will be shipped by

January 2014.

On arrival to Maldives Port, the machine will be taken to the Naifaru by Eco Youth and installed for use. A special ceremony is planned to be held

to start the operation.

Island: Lh. Olhuvelifushi

**Project Title:** Installation of sound system in Masjid ul Zikra in Olhuvelifushi

Funding Amount: USD 4,040.54

**Project Summary:** By the initiation of 'Association for Olhuvelifushi Youth' the project was



table and a LED projector to the NGO. All the sports items have been place in the indoor games centre and are open during specific hours on

every day.

**Project Status:** All items were donated to the NGO by April 2013. But then the doors and

windows of some classrooms were not fixed and the project had to be delayed. After much effort from school and NGO the doors and windows for the classrooms were procured and fixed. By the end of 2013, the LCD TV's were installed in the classrooms. They are now used as a means of

teaching.

# PROJECT ACTIVITIES CARRIED FORWARD FROM 2012 AND OTHER AD-HOC PROJECTS

Island: Ha. Hoarafushi

Project Title: Renovation of the damages caused to 'Adam Saleem Handhaanee

Preschool' due to the heavy rain caused to Ha. Hoarafushi during October

2012.

Funding Amount: USD 5,205.10

Project Introduction: This project was proposed by 'Adam Saleem Handhaanee Preschool' on

December 2012 with the aim of renovating the damages caused by the rain storm that hit the island on October 2012. After reviewing the proposal, AFTF executive board decided to fund for the project, so an

agreement was signed on February 2013.

**Project Status:** All items for the project was donated and delivered to the island on 5<sup>th</sup>

February. Soon after on 20<sup>th</sup> February the renovation works started. At first all the furniture was assembles and placed in the school administrative office and classes. This part of the work was completed by 1<sup>st</sup> March. After that, tiling and painting works started and with the help from staffs and parents it was completed by 9<sup>th</sup> March. Later on, items donated from other parties such as ceiling fans and LCD TV were installed on the classroom. By 31<sup>st</sup> March 2013, the renovation work of 'Adam

Saleem Handhaanee Preschool' was completed.

Island: Ha. Thuraakunu

**Project Title:** Laying of pipes for Sewerage system in Ha. Thuraakunu

Funded Amount: USD 2,626.46

Project Introduction: This project is an initiation of the Executive board of Alifulhu Thuthu

Foundation. Under the project AFTF plans to lay the sewerage system in Thuraakunu. To implement the project, AFTF signed on a partnership agreement with Ministry of Environment and Energy and Thuraakunu

Council.

**Project Status:** As per the agreement signed with MOEE and Thuraakunu Council on 7<sup>th</sup>

May 2013, all the administrative work will be carried out by the council while MOEE will be giving technical assistance if necessary. AFTF will be acting as funding agent and procurement and bidding for consultants and

contractors.

After the agreement was signed, a design consultant was hired by AFTF to do the Environment Impact Assessment (EIA) and detailed design report. By the end of 2013, the detailed design report and EIA report has been submitted to MOEE for approval. It is estimated to start the physical works of the project with a contractor during the first quarter of 2014.

Island: Sh. Maaungoodhoo

**Project Title:** Construction of a funeral parlor in Sh. Maaungoodhoo

Project funds utilized in 2012

Project Introduction: The project proposal was submitted by Maaungoodhoo Island Council for

the construction of a funeral parlor. Earlier funerals were held at houses, but due to lack of space and congestion, it has become difficult to carry out funerals. After reviewing the project proposal by the executive committee, AFTF board decided to donate part of the funds for the construction and funding agreement was signed with Maaungoodhoo

Island Council.

Project Status: On January 2013, invitation to the public to submit bids for the

construction of the funeral home was opened. But the bid documents

were incomplete and cancelled. Invitation for bids was again opened on February and after evaluation, most suitable party was than selected for the project. The construction work started on February 2013 and was completed on December 2013. The funeral parlor is now in use and the council will undertake any necessary maintenance works if necessary.

N. Velidhoo Island:

**Project Title:** Construction of Community Centre in N. Velidhoo

**Funding Amount:** USD 813.35

Project Introduction: The construction work and the roofing of the community centre were completed when AFTF team visited the island in 2011. The flooring was done with assistance from another donor before AFTF approved the project. The project was proposed by 8 NGO's in the island in agreement with 8 NGO's to implement the project. The proposal was submitted to complete some of the finishing works of the building. Later 8 NGO's requested for assistance from AFTF to complete the Community Centre. This preposition was reviewed and executive committee decided to fund for the completion of the project.

> AFTF donations were delivered in the year 2011 and work progressed during the year. In 2011 AFTF's donation worth upto USD 43,470.34 while a further USD 18,769.36 worth of materials were donated in 2012.

> In 2012, plastering works of all interior and exterior walls, fixing of all doors and windows, completion of sewerage systems and water wells, all plumbing works, completion of 4 toilets and flooring were fully completed. Work-in progress included painting works, construction of steps for the main entrance. In addition ceiling works of the building have been completed except for the store area due to lack of materials.

**Project Status:** 

Although no physical activities of the project were carried out in 2013, the implementing committee of the project held 2 meetings.

The first meeting was to discuss the issues highlighted in the letter sent from AFTF on 23 August 2013. After the meeting on 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2013, the list of items needed for the roofing was send to AFTF. But since the

quotation was missing, AFTF requested for the quotation of the items. This list was provided on December 2013.

At the second meeting, it was decided to carry out the electrical wiring work of the Community centre. The request for permission was sent on 11 June 2013 and the permission was granted to the implementing committee to carry out the electrical wiring works as per the agreement with the contractor. However, this work did not start during the year.

Island: Lh. Kurendhoo

**Project Title:** Construction of a funeral parlor in Lh. Kurendhoo

**Project funds utilized in 2012** 

Project Introduction: The project proposal was submitted by Kurendhoo Island Council for the

construction of a funeral parlor. Earlier funerals were held at houses, but due to lack of space and congestion, it has become difficult to carry out funerals. After reviewing the project proposal by the executive committee, AFTF board decided to donate part of the funds for the construction and funding agreement was signed with Kurendhoo Island

Council on December 2012.

**Project Status:** The construction of the funeral parlor began on January 2013 in the

backyard of Masjid ul Dhaarul Asaar. The funds approved by AFTF was not sufficient for the completion of the building, however the building was completed with other assistance from islanders and other parties. The funeral parlor was completed on 16<sup>th</sup> August 2013 and is now used for all funerals in the island. The building will be maintained under the

council.



Island: K. Dhiffushi

**Project Title:** Expansion of Health Centre in K. Dhiffushi

Project funds utilized in 2012

Project Introduction: The project proposal was submitted by Dhiffushi island council to Meeru

Island resort management. The project was then passed to AFTF by the resort management. After revising the proposal by AFTF Executive board, the project was approved for funding on May 2013. The extension for the building includes an admission ward, labour room, vaccination room;

public information room and storage are included.

**Project Status:** By the end of 2013, the detailed drawing of the building extension and

the BOQ needed were provided by Ministry of Health and Family to AFTF. AFTF is than seeking for a suitable contractor to undertake the construction phase of the project. We estimate that the construction

works will begin during the first quarter of the year.

**Island:** Th. Vilufushi

**Project Title:** Digitalizing Vilifushi School

Project funds utilized in 2012

Project Introduction: The project proposal was submitted to AFTF on October 2012 by the

school board and PTA. This project aims at installation of smart boards in all classrooms of Vilufushi School. The project is implemented by school board, PTA and the island community. After evaluation of the proposal, AFTF board decided to fund for the project on December 2012. After signing the agreement with AFTF in December 2012, quotations for the equipment were taken and installation was opened for bidding. After evaluation of the bids, the project was than awarded to the contractor

with the lowest price on the bid.

**Project Status:** The physical work of the project started in January 2013 and installation

of all smart boards were completed by 7<sup>th</sup> March. Than all tiling works of the classrooms began started and were completed by April. By end of

April 2013, the project completed all its work. A special ceremony with Minister of Education Dr. Asim was held to mark the completion of the project and beginning of teaching with thr help of smart boards.

Island: Gdh. Madaveli

**Project Title:** Constructing the new building of Aminath Hassan Pre-school.

**Funding Amount:** USD 5,331.23

Project Introduction: Aminath Hassan Preschool is the only preschool in Gdh. Madavehi managed and operated by a private individual. Due to lack of space in the present building, in August 2009 construction works of a new building was started. By June 2012 when the proposal was submitted to AFTF, the foundation works of the building was laid and walls were built.

> After reviewing the proposal, AFTF executive board decided to fund for the completion of the building. The new building consists of 3 classrooms, a staffroom, an office and 2 toilets. For the ease of completion, the project was divided into three phases. The first phase consists of roofing the whole building while the second phase consists of flooring works, plastering works of all interior and exterior walls of the building and electrical wiring works. The final phase consists of ceiling works, painting and all other works necessary for the completion of the building.

**Project Status:** 

By December 2012, all works of the first phase were completed and items for the second phase were delivered to the island.

Therefore in 2013, the physical works of the second phase was carried out and completed with the exception of ceiling works of 1 classroom. Though the new building was completely not finished, due to the difficulty in space 1 classroom was completed and teaching started in the second term in the new building. By end of 2013, ceiling works and building finishing works were been carried out. The school management expects to complete the building fully and hold a ceremony for the official opening of the school by February 2013.

# PROJECT ACTIVITIES WITH NGOs IN MALE'

Island: Male'

**Project Title:** Drop-in Centre of Journey NGO

Funding Amount: USD 28,113.62

Project Introduction: Journey is an NGO formed in 2005 based in Male' working with the

government and other non-governmental organizations with a mission to help and support drug users to recover from diseases of addiction and educate the community on drugs and HIV. As well as educating the youth to deviate from experimenting the drugs and stray away from engaging in

risky behaviour associated with HIV.

The project proposal was submitted by Journey along with a presentation to the AFTF executive board requesting to fund the Drop-In centre of Journey. After discussion AFTF board decided to fund the centre for the

year 2013.
